Agfomatic 2000 Pocket

The Agfomatic 2000 pocket is a 110 cartridge film pocket camera made by Agfa in Germany in 1973. The Agfomatic 2000 is an extremely basic manual point and shoot device with no electronic or automation of any kind. The original price for the Pocket camera was 105DM (Deutsche Mark)

Film type was 110 film with a format of 13 x 17mm, maximum number of views was 20. The viewfinder was fixed internal and lens was fixed focus with a focus range of 1.2m/ 4 ft. to infinity. Aperture was f9.5. This camera does not have interchangeable backs or rewind functions. The built in flash is a magicube/flashcube type.

Shutter speed of 1/100 and 1/50s was selected by weather symbols, sun (1/100) & Cloud (1/50).when flash is attached the camera speed is automatically 1/50sec. Flash is provided by magicube. Like most Agfomatic pocket cameras it has the push-pull film advance, meaning that opening and closing the camera once after exposure causes the film to advance to the next image frame, and the shutter release button is red.
